Rules and Regulations

Float Safety

- ✓ All floats must be properly maintained to avoid the chance of breakdown during the Parade
- ✓ The float driver must be fully licensed
- ✓ All floats must carry an operational fire extinguisher (dry chemical, at least 5 lbs). The float driver must be familiar with how to use the fire extinguisher
- ✓ The local Fire Department may conduct inspections prior to the parade
- ✓ The exhaust pipe must be securely wrapped with fire protective material in case of any accidental touching of flammable decoration
- ✓ All those who travel on a float must wear a safety belt or hold onto a secure handhold while the float is moving

Insurance

✓ All parade vehicles must be insured – **proof of insurance must be supplied.**

Participation

- ✓ Ensure you complete the application form accurately **as the measurements you provide are the measurements we use** to mark the street for your line-up position
- ✓ The media have a copy of the list to report each entrant as it passes by them the parade is filmed live by Shaw Cable therefore, please do not change places

- ✓ Our registration table will be set up at the Library/Museum car park (785 Main St.) at 7 am. All parade participants (one member from each entrant) must report to the registration table to confirm their attendance and place in the line-up
- ✓ Floats that wish to be judged must be in place by 7:45 am. Royalty and other participants must be in place on their float
- ✓ The parade begins at 10 am at Main Street and Eckhardt Avenue. Participants move north on Main Street to Lakeshore Drive, left on Wade Avenue, right on Winnipeg Street and then left on Lakeshore Drive to the Rose Garden car park
- ✓ Parade entrants must observe 25 feet of space between themselves and the participant in front
- ✓ Volunteers are placed along the parade route and they have the authority to regulate the spacing of participants and correct any inadmissible behaviour
- ✓ In the unfortunate event of a breakdown, volunteers will help to move the entry to the curb. Parade participants will manoeuvre around it and keep the parade moving
- ✓ All parade entries, including commercial entries, must be fully decorated or could be refused entry.

Inadmissible Behaviour

- ✓ Participants must not throw anything to the spectators
- ✓ Participants must not encourage spectators to leave the sidewalk and mingle in the parade
- ✓ Participants must not be in possession of any alcohol or drugs. Those found to be in possession will be reported to the police and removed from the parade

Admissible Behaviour

- ✓ Participants can walk up to spectators and offer them candy, information leaflets and flowers
- ✓ Those collecting cash and food for the local food bank can mingle among spectators
- ✓ Participants are encouraged to sing, dance, laugh, make music, inspire others and have a wonderful time

Animals

- ✓ Well behaved animals are welcome in the Penticton Peach Festival Parade
- ✓ Horse entrants must have a costumed pooper scooper
- ✓ Dog entrants must be on a leash and have a costumed pooper scooper
- ✓ Owners/guardians of animals must provide water buckets and dishes for their own animals

Parade participants must observe these rules and, should an emergency circumstance arise, follow instructions from police and parade officials.
